SAC Celebrates the 38th SAARC Charter Day

The SAARC Agriculture Centre, Dhaka, Bangladesh celebrated the 38th SAARC Charter Day on 8th December 2022. Honourable Ambassador Masud Bin Momen, Senior Secretary, Ministry of Foreign Affairs attended this event as Chief Guest. Dr. Nahid Rashid, Secretary Ministry of Fisheries and Livestock joined as Special Guest and Dr. Shaikh Mohammad Bokhtiar, Executive Cheirman, Bangladesh Agriculture Reserch Council (BARC) chaired the program. Dr. Md. Baktear Hossain, Director SAARC Agriculture Centre (SAC) made a welcome speech. Dr. Himanshu Pathak, Secretary, Department of Agricultural Research and Education (DARE) and Director General of Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR), Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare, India was present as the key note speaker at BARC Auditorium. The celebration began with the hoisting of flags of SAARC Member States by the dignitaries of the High Commissions/ Embassies, senior officials of the BARC and NARS. It was followed by release of pigeon to spread the message of Peace, Support and Cooperation among SAARC Member States.

The technical session commenced with the welcome address by Dr. Md. Baktear Hossain, Director, SAC, Dhaka, Bangladesh. After welcoming the guests and dignitaries, he made a brief presentation on the year-round activities of the SAC in the field of crops, livestock, fisheries, horticulture, natural resources management and policy for the benefit of the SAARC Member



He also highlighted the recent achievements of the centre particularly on publication of books, policy briefs and SAARC Journal of Agriculture etc. He informed the house about the recent approval of multi-country project on Consortium for Scaling-up Climate Smart Agriculture in South Asia, supported by IFAD as well as on going multi-country project entitled Livelihood enhancement of the small farmers in SAARC region through small scale agro-business focusing on value chain development, supported by SAARC Development Fund.

Dr. Himanshu Pathak, Secretary, DARE and Director General, ICAR, Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare, India delivered the keynote address on Transforming Agrifood Systems in South Asia. He highlighted the impact of climate change on crop production systems, soil, water, biodiversity and pest infestation whice all effects on poor farmers and they are the worst sufferer. agriculture is the source and sufferer of climate change but can be a solution. As the current South Asian agriculture is concentrate on industrial driven agriculture, hence, keeping 5Ms (Market, Monsoon, management, Mechanization, Manpower) in mind, emphasis should be given on FARM building, Climate SMART agriculture, precision agriculture, safe and nutritious food, healthy diet, emerging technologies and integrated traditional and underutilised crops. He also mentioned that climate-smart technologies are available and also emerging, need reorientation and upscaling and integration with traditional systems, need international collaboration and institutional coordination for resources and implementation, a mission mode approach is needed to promote climate-smart technologies to make significant impacts. SAARC can play a big role, students, scientists and farmers need to be equipped with new skills and tools to make agriculture climate smart.

Dr. Nahid Rashid, Secretary, Ministry of Fisheries and Livestock Government of the People's Republic of Bangladesh graced the occasion as Special Guest. She applauded the SAARC Agriculture Centre for its countless achievements in the field of regional capacity building, expert consultation meeting, policy guidelines and worthy publication on emerging challenges of South Asian agriculture and allied sectors. She emphasized that the fisheries and livestock sector has been playing an important role in the economy uplift efforts of



Almost 80% of the country's protein requirements come from this sub-sector. This sector has much potential to develop as a commercial sector with employment and income generating opportunities both in the rural and urban areas. A large number of enterprises of cattle, poultry and dairy farms have grown in the private sector in recent years she added.

Ambassador Masud Bin Momen, the Foreign Secretary (Senior Secretary), Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Government of the People's Republic of Bangladesh, grace the occasion as Chief Guest. Baktear Hossain, Director, SAC and Dr. Younus Ali, Senior Technical Officer (STO) visited Buffalo Farm of Bangladesh Milk Producer's Cooperative Union Ltd (Milk Vita) at Takerhat, Madaripur, on 17 December 2022 to review the performance of Murrah buffalo calves born through artificial insemination of pedigreed buffalo semen under the initiative on High Yielding Dairy Breed Development in SAARC Countries. All the calves born through artificial insemination are sound healthy and growing well with the dietary schedule adopted by the management of the farm. The average milk production found to be 4-5 litrs/day/buffalo from first generation offspring (F1) of Murrah buffalo.
