


# Visit of Women led organic agriculture and poultry farming and Community Service Provider activities at WHH in Sirajganj district of Bangladesh

# **Inventory of Potential CSA Technologies, Success Stories & Capacity Building Meeting with Regional Collaborators of C-SUCSeS Project**



A meeting on "Inventory of Potential CSA Technologies, Success Stories & Capacity Building" under the C-SUCSeS Project was held on 3<sup>rd</sup> June 2025, 28 participants attended by virtually from six SAARC countries—Bangladesh, Bhutan, India, Nepal, Pakistan, and Sri Lanka.

Dr. Md. Harunur Rashid, Director of SAC, inaugurated the session, emphasizing the importance of shared learning for policy and institutional adoption of CSA technologies. Dr. Raza Ullah Khan, SPA (NRM) and Regional Program Coordinator, urged member countries to present 2–3 key success stories during the upcoming Results Presentation.

National Focal Points and scientists shared impactful outcomes from participatory research and stressed the need for continued training and collaboration. The particepants reiterated the commitment to scaling climate-smart practices across the region. The meeting concluded with a note of thanks from the Director of SAC, emphasising on the need of cross-country collaboration, learning and timely progress toward project completion.

# Monitoring and Evaluation of Participatory Research Conducted under C-SUCSeS Project in Sri Lanka

A team from SAARC Agriculture Centre (SAC), comprises of Director, SAARC Agriculture Centre Dr. Md. Harunur Rashid, Dr. Raza Ullah Khan, Dr. Rumana Azad, and Md. Abdul Goffar, visited Sri Lanka from 24–25 June 2025 to monitor participatory research under the C-SUCSeS project.

On 24 June, the team visited the Plant Genetic Resources Centre (PGRC) in Gannoruwa, Peradeniya, observing diverse germplasm collections vital for climate-resilient agriculture. The PGRC's GenBank plays a crucial role in providing breeding materials for future variety development in Sri Lanka and the region.



On 25<sup>th</sup> June, accompanied by Mr. R. A. C. J. Perera of the Natural Resources Management Centre, SAC team visited Climate Smart Farmer Training School (CSFTS) and surrounding participatory research sites in Thirappane, Anuradhapura. The visit observed increased women's participation, improved crop productivity through solar-powered micro irrigation, and successful adoption of Climate-Smart Agriculture (CSA) technologies. It was observed that despite positive outcomes, challenges such as high initial costs, limited technical knowledge, and institutional support remained continued. Scaling up training, demonstrations, and incentives were recommended to accelerate CSA adoption.





# Results Presentation Meeting and Way Forward of C-SUCSeS Project held at Colombo, Sri Lanka

Two days 'Results Presentation Meeting and Way Forward' was held on 27-28 June 2025 at Hotel Ramada, Colombo, Sri Lanka in IFAD and SDF funded project on "Consortium for Scaling up Climate Smart Agriculture in South Asia". The meeting was attended by Mr. Abdulkarim, Sma, Lead Economist IFAD, Ms. Irosha Cooray, Officer Incharge (OIC) SDF, Dr. Shahidur Rashid, Director IFPRI, Md. Dr. Harunur Rashid, Director SAC, Dr. Raza Ullah Khan, RPC, C-SUCSeS project team and scientists of National Agriculture Research and Extension system (NARES) of SAARC member countries (MCs)



Abdulkarim Sma, Ms. Irosha Cooray, Dr. Shahidur Rashid were Special Guests. The Chief Guest elaborated the investment plan, Sri Lankan Government is pursuing to develop agriculture sector of the country and emphasized on learning from each other to develop collective wisdom against climate change impacts.

The technical session of day 1 (27<sup>th</sup> June 2025) started with country presentation by NPP sharing success stories, lessons learnt and need for sustainability of the project. The technical session on second day (28<sup>th</sup> June), resource persons from IFPRI talked about the importance of including fisheries and crop sectors in phase-II, the scalability, and dissemination of the project results.

The two days meeting started with traditional candle lighting followed by welcome address by Director SAC. Mr. D.P. Wickramasinghe, Secretary, Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock, Land and Irrigation, Government of Sri Lanka was the Chief Guest at the inaugural session, while Mr. Abdulkarim Sma, Ms. Irosha Cooray, Dr. Shahidur Rashid were Special Guests. The Chief Guest elaborated the investment plan, Sri Lankan Government is pursuing to develop agriculture sector of the country and emphasized on learning from each other to develop collective wisdom against climate change impacts.

The technical session of day 1 (27<sup>th</sup> June 2025) started with country presentation by NPP sharing success stories, lessons learnt and need for sustainability of the project. Dr. Raza Ullah Khan, RPC presented the scope and support for including livestock and fisheries in the second phase of the project and the need for strengthening Community of Practice (CoP). Dr. Shahidur Rashid, IFPRI emphasized on the need for partnership and upscaling, broaden our partnership" not to broaden scope of the project, he further added that a team is needed to coordinate with SAC, IFAD, IFPRI while



working with multiple partners, and the need for "cross learning" as climate change do not care for boundaries and countries. Ms. Irosha Cooray, SDF stressed on the need to look whether the proposed phase-II of the C-SUCSeS project is aligned with the institutional mandate, goals and the thematic priorities. She added that though we are already there, but we need to look again at the strategic alignment of the phase-II, relevancy and justification etc. Therefore, we need to be more focus and specific, what are justifications, and what are the problems which we are going to address. As we are going with several countries, we need to be more specific. We need to be more specific and focus on project methodologies and project design etc. Mr. Tanvir Ahmad Torophder, Director ARD, SAARC Secretariat, Nepal stressed upon the need for the second phase of the project, he called upon inhouse capability to ensure intime and qualitive assurance in deliver abilities of the project. Mr. Abdulkarim Sma. IFAD talked about developing a scaling up strategy for the phase-II of the C-SUCSeS project. He added that we need to consider specific technologies for example to pick 1-2 CSA technologies say AWD and develop 'pathway' how far we can scale up this technology from baseline point look for the investment plan and policy support from respective governments to upscale such technologies. The two days meeting ended by vote of thanks remarks by Director SAC Dr. Md. Harunur Rashid.
